No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2025-00448; Lisa Burke

Dear Lisa Burke:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to an anonymous complaint alleging that you violated the Act’s conflict of interest provisions. Our investigation determined that there was insufficient evidence to support a finding that you violated the Act’s conflict of interest provisions.

However, the Enforcement Division found that as a result of your position as a Health Facility Evaluator Nurse for the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), the Act required you to periodically file Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”), and that you failed to timely file your 2020, 2021, and 2022 Annual SEIs, and failed to disclose a reportable source of income on your 2023 and 2024 Annual SEIs.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (“PREP”) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you subsequently amended your SEIs to disclose your community property share of your spouse’s income. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., failure to timely file your 2020, 2021, and 2022 Annual SEIs, assessed by your filing officer, Hannah Chavez of CDPH, pursuant to Section 91013.
