No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2025-01285; Hector Valencia

Dear Hector Valencia:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (“CDCR”) alleging that you failed to timely file your 2024 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Correctional Food Manager II for CDCR.

The Enforcement Division has since learned that there were several mitigating factors that contributed to your ability to timely file the 2024 Annual SEI. Additionally, you have since filed the 2024 Annual SEI. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, CDCR.
