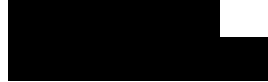

**No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2023-00526; Scot McBrian for Board of Trustee 2022, Scot McBrian, Christina McBrian**

Dear Committee:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).<sup>1</sup> This letter is in response to a referral from San Joaquin County alleging that you failed to timely file pre-election campaign statements for the reporting periods of July 1, 2022 through September 24, 2022 and September 25, 2022 through October 22, 2022.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Campaign for Local Candidates and Candidate-Controlled Committees. In addition, you have filed the missing campaign statement(s). For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, San Joaquin County, for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, pursuant to Section 91013.
