No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2025-01152; David Monahan

Dear David Monahan,

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to an anonymous complaint alleging that you failed to timely file to file campaign statements as a major donor committee.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Campaign for Independent Expenditure and Major Donor Committees. In addition, you have filed the missing campaign statement(s). For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024), assessed by your filing officer, the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters, pursuant to Section 91013.
