No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2025-01101; Destiny Rivas

Dear Destiny Rivas:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (the “Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging that you failed to timely file your Assuming Office Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) and several Annual SEIs for your position as a Member of the Measure A Citizens' Advisory Committee for the City of Stockton.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the applicable SEIs. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., failure to timely file your Assuming Office SEI and 2023, 2024, and 2025 Annual SEIs, assessed by your filing officer, the City of Stockton, pursuant to Section 91013.
