No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2024-00419; Robert Cancio, Maria Johnson, Rocio Cancio, and Friends of Robert Cancio 2021 For NLMUSD School Board

Dear Respondents:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk indicating that you failed to timely file an amendment to the statement or organization for your candidate-controlled committee, Friends of Robert Cancio 2021 For NLMUSD School Board (“the Committee”).

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Campaign Reporting for Local Candidates and Candidate-Controlled Committees. In addition, you have amended the applicable preelection and semi-annual campaign statements to report all campaign activity and have filed an amendment to the statement or organization disclosing the Committee’s qualification date.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file your semi-annual campaign statement covering the reporting period of 1/1/2024 to 6/30/2024), assessed by your filing officer, the County of Los Angeles, pursuant to Section 91013.
