No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2023-00338; Benny Young

Dear Benny Young:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging that you failed to disclose certain economic interests on your Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as a Management Specialist with the County of Monterey Public Works, Facilities, and Parks Department.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed an outstanding Assuming Office SEI and filed amendments to your Annual SEIs to disclose your reportable economic interests. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., failure to timely file your Assuming Office SEI, assessed by your filing officer, the County of Monterey, pursuant to Section 91013.
