No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2026-00154; Caryn Lozada

Dear Caryn Lozada:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging that you failed to disclose certain economic interests on each Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your former position as the Development Review Coordinator for the Water Department of the City of Santa Rosa.

After our review of the case, the Enforcement Division has found insufficient evidence of a violation of the Act. Specifically, the purported interest was not reportable under the City’s then-applicable Conflict of Interest Code, which required that persons holding your designated position disclose any business entity, management position in any business entity, or source of income which does business with the City of Santa Rosa, or has done business with the City during the two years prior to the time a statement is required to be filed, through the filer’s department or agency. Therefore, we are closing this matter without further action.
