No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2026-00025; Jennifer Brooks, EM Ranch Owner LLC

Dear Jennifer Brooks:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a Commission-initiated investigation into the allegation that you failed to timely file your Form 461 after contributions were made to Moving California Forward. These contributions include: \$5,500 on June 13, 2024, and \$10,000 on October 4, 2024. Form 461 was due on July 31, 2024 for the June 13, 2024, contribution. Form 461 was due on January 31, 2025, for the October 4, 2024, contribution.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Major Donor and Independent Expenditure Committees. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file Form 461 campaign statement(s), assessed by your filing officer, pursuant to Section 91013.)
