No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2026-00245; Don Taylor

Dear Don Taylor:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the County of Santa Clara regarding your failure to timely file your 2024 Annual Statement of Economic Interests (“SEI”) for your position as a Member for the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council.

The Enforcement Division recently contacted you, and you explained that you did not have access to the email address and phone number used by the County of Santa Clara to send notifications regarding your requirement to file the 2024 Annual SEI. You have since filed the 2024 Annual SEI. Additionally, the County of Santa Clara has updated your contact information. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the County of Santa Clara.
