No Action Closure Letter re FPPC No. 2026-00434; Juli Healy

Dear Juli Healy:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a sworn complaint alleging that you failed to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports (Form 497) within the 24-hour deadlines and that you disclosed the incorrect contribution date on your 1st pre-election statement for a contribution that was received on March 30, 2026.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding Campaigns for Local Candidates and Candidate-Controlled Committees. In addition, you have filed the missing campaign statement. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement (i.e., failure to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports) assessed by your filing officer, Tuolumne County Clerk-Recorder’s Office pursuant to Section 91013.
