ORANGE CITY COUNCIL APPOINTS KATHY TAVOULARIS TO DISTRICT 3 COUNCIL SEAT



On April 13, the Orange City Council appointed longtime resident Kathy Tavoularis to fill the vacant Council seat for District 3.

Ms. Tavoularis is a 40-year resident of Orange, a graduate of the Orange Unified School District, holds a B.A. in Political Science from the California State

University, Long Beach, and has an extensive background in government and public affairs. She is a small business owner in Orange, and the youngest child of immigrant small business owners. Her older brother, Peter Tavoularis, who unexpectedly passed away in October, was a teacher and coach at Orange High School for eighteen years, where his students affectionately knew him as "Coach T." Her sister is an attorney for the County of Orange. Ms. Tavoularis is a supporter of causes related to American patriotism and history, and her own Greek heritage.

Per State Government Code, the City Council had the choice to either appoint a resident of the 3rd District to fill the vacant seat, or to call a special district election for November, 2021. With the appointment of Ms. Tavoularis, the District 3 seat will be up for election in the General Municipal Election on November 8, 2022.

ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS


Protecting what makes our neighborhoods a great place to live sometimes means finding solutions when faced with the unintended consequences of well-meaning state legislation.

In 2020, new California laws meant to address the state's housing shortage drastically reduced the restrictions on construction of developments known as Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs.) ADUs are small apartment-type spaces, sometimes known as "granny flats," meant to house one or two people. The new laws essentially blocked local municipal control of the approval process of ADUs, which removed many of the safeguards in place that allowed cities to stop projects that could prove detrimental to a neighborhoods safety, health, or quality of life.

Almost immediately, for-profit entities began to take advantage of a massive loophole in the new ADU law, and began the process of converting houses in single-family home neighborhoods into massive dormitories and boarding houses. The developer's own literature *(continued on page 5)*

HOLIDAY REMINDER

SHORT-TERM RENTALS

At their April 13th meeting, the Orange City Council approved a series of Ordinances that allows the regulating, licensing, and establishment of short term rentals in the City. The Ordinances also establish a limit on the number of properties that will be allowed permits, establishes permit fees, and prioritizes properties that are owner occupied or owned by residents of Orange. Orange will also be establishing guidelines detailing how staff will deal with properties not in compliance with City codes.
