Dear Mr. Morgan:

This letter is in response to your letter to the Fair Political Practices Commission in which you request an extension of time to file and permission to combine two campaign statements required under Government Code Section 84204.

The Political Reform Act does not provide the Commission or any other responsible agency with the authority to grant filing deadline extensions or to allow statements required under this section to be combined.

Based on the information provided in your letter concerning petition circulation deadlines a campaign statement in connection with your first circulation effort should have been filed no later than 35 days after April 28, 1980. This report should include all money raised and spent in connection with the first initiative. The next report will be required no later than 35 days after the deadline for filing petitions or the date of notification that the measure has qualified or failed to qualify whichever is earlier.

RE: REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

This letter is to request authorization to file a single report for our campaign. The purpose for this request is based upon the following set of circumstances surrounding our initiative drive.

We initially filed our initiative in October 1979, and received our title and summary from the Attorney General on November 28, 1979. The 150 day period was due to expire on April 28, 1980.

However, due to internal organization problems we decided to abandon our efforts in collecting signatures and consequently informed the Secretary of State and the Attorney General of our intent on or about January 21, 1980.

On or about January 22, 1980, we refiled our initiative with the Attorney General and received a new title and summary from the Attorney General on or about March 1, 1980. Our 150 day period for circulating our petitions is due to expire on or about August 1, 1980.

Since it would be difficult to separate the expenditures of our first effort from the second, we respectfully request that we be permitted to file a single report with your office on or before September 5, 1980.

That deadline would be in compliance with the 35 day reporting requirement after our August 1, 1980, date for filing our petitions.

We will fully comply with the provisions of the Fair Political Practices Act, and ask favorable consideration for our request.
