Dear Mr. Rogers:

Pursuant to your request, this letter is to confirm my advice to you during our telephone conversation of yesterday, Thursday, January 22, 1981.

Specifically, you asked when does the cumulation period end under the 1980 provisions of the Political Reform Act.

Government Code Section 82018 defines "cumulative amount" in part as--the amount contributed or expended since the closing date of the most recent post-election statement which was required to be filed by the filer. The period for which all contributions from a single source were to be combined began with the closing date of the last post-election statement filed and ended on the closing date of the next post-election statement.

The filing of semi-annual campaign statements during off election year periods did not end the obligation to continue cumulating receipts and expenditures.

As a result of legislation passed, signed into law and effective as of January 1, 1981, the new provisions concerning the "cumulative" amount of receipts and expenditures has been changed. The new Government Code Section 82018 now states that, "cumulative amount means the amount of contributions received or expenditures made in a calendar year." That is that the cumulation period will begin on January 1, 1981 and end on December 31, 1981.
