Dear Mr. Cameron:

You have requested advice concerning the campaign provisions of the Political Reform Act.<sup>1/</sup> Your letter states only a general question. Therefore, we consider it to be a request for informal assistance pursuant to Regulation 18329(c).<sup>2/</sup>

## QUESTION

What is the filing requirement for a committee primarily formed to support the qualification of a ballot measure when the committee's qualification effort extends over two years?

## CONCLUSION

The period covered in the initial campaign report required of a committee primarily formed to support the qualification of a ballot measure begins on January 1 of the year in which the qualification effort began through seven days prior to the date when the statement is due. The statement is due not later than 21 days after the date any petitions are filed or 21 days after the deadline for filing petitions, whichever is earlier.

**ANALYSIS**

A committee formed or existing primarily to support the qualification of a ballot measure must file its first campaign statement disclosing contributions received and expenditures made in connection with the qualification effort 21 days after any petitions are filed, or 21 days after the deadline for filing petitions, whichever is earlier. The closing date for the period is seven days prior to the deadline for filing the statement. (Section 84200.5(f).)


When the qualification effort extends over two calendar years, the period covered in the 21-day post-qualification campaign statement begins on January 1 of the year the qualification effort began. (Section 82018.) Thus, the statement will disclose activity which occurred in two calendar years.

After filing the 21-day post-qualification statement, the committee may have additional filing obligations depending on its activities. Enclosed is the 1989 "Information Manual On Campaign Disclosure Provisions of the Political Reform Act" which describes committee disclosure requirements.

Dear Gentlepersons:

I want to confirm that the first campaign report that needs to be filed for an initiative is 21 days after any petitions are filed, or 21 days after the deadline for filing petitions, whichever is earlier.

My specific question is, does this rule apply even when the initiative is kicked off in the fall of one year and the petitions are filed in the spring of the next year?

If so, does the first report cover the whole 12 months of the first calendar year and from January 1st of the second calendar year through seven days prior to the date when the statement is due?
