Dear Ms. Randolph:

This letter is in response to your request for confirmation of the telephone advice provided to you on September 14, 1990, regarding the filing and disclosure obligations of members of the Board of Retirement of Kern County Employees' Retirement Association under the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹

Your letter correctly states our advice. Pending adoption of proposed Regulation 18720, which clarifies the term "other public officials who manage public investments" as that term is used in Section 87200, members of the Board of Retirement of Kern County Employees' Retirement Association should continue to file Commission Form 730, Statements of Economic Interests. Should the Commission adopt proposed Regulation 18720 and include members of the board among those public officials who must file Commission Form 721, Statements of Economic Interests, you will be notified.
