Dear Dr. Alva:

This is in response to your request for confirmation of telephone advice regarding the campaign disclosure provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").¹ You are requesting this advice on behalf of Salvador Alva.

Your letter, dated May 26, 1992, accurately summarizes the telephone advice I provided to you that the Political Reform Act does not prohibit a judicial candidate from identifying his or her opponent's political party in mass mailings. The Commission only has jurisdiction over the Political Reform Act. You may wish to contact the Attorney General's office or the Secretary of State to determine whether any other law may apply.
